15 16 17	A LAW OF THE MUSCOGEE (CREEK) NATION AMENDING MCNCA TITLE 23, ENTITLED "WILDLIFE CODE"
18 19	Be it enacted by the National Council of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation:
20 21	SECTION ONE. <u>FINDINGS</u> . The National Council finds that:
<ul><li>22</li><li>23</li><li>24</li><li>25</li><li>26</li></ul>	A. The Department of Interior Affairs, Division of Agriculture and Natural Resources conducts an annual review of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation Hunting and Fishing Code and wildlife regulations.
26 27 28 29 30	B. The 2024 annual review indicates the need to adopt minor changes to the wildlife code to increase clarity of ambiguous topics, to better the enforcement of the Code, further public safety, and to adopt best practices for the management of wildlife populations.
31 32 33 34 35 36 37 38 39 40 41 42	SECTION TWO. AMENDMENT. This amendment shall be codified in Title 23, of the Code of Laws of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation; provided that for purposes of codification of said new law and its inclusion in pocket parts for the Code of Laws of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation, the Attorney General is hereby authorized: (1) to approve any changes related to the manner in which sections, articles, chapters and sub-chapters are designated in this law in order to be consistent with the format in the Code of Laws published in 2010 by West Publishing Company; (2) to include footnoted references to the legislative history in said pocket parts to the Code of Laws; and (3) to note in said pocket parts any editorial correction of minor clerical or grammatical errors in the following new law:
43 44 45	<b>SECTION THREE.</b> <u>AMENDMENT</u> . MCNCA Title 23, §§ 3–301, 312, 316, 317, 319 and 321 is hereby amended to read as follows:
45 46 47	§ 3-301. Requirement of Tribal license, permit, and/or tag

1 Except as provided for in § 2-302 of this Code, no person shall engage in the activity of 2 hunting, fishing, trapping or gathering, including cutting or harvesting live or downed 3 timber which requires approval from the United States government, or any other activity regulated by this Code or conservation regulations, without acquiring or having in his/her 4 5 possession a valid Tribal license, permit and/or tag as this Code or conservation 6 regulations may require, validated for the particular season and activity in which that 7 person is engaged. 8 9 ID Required. Every person applying for any license, tag, or permit required by this Code or any regulation adopted pursuant to this Code shall provide 10 a form of identification alongside this application. Approved forms of identification 11 shall include but not limited to: 12 13 14 **Certificates of Degree of Indian blood:** 1. 2. 3. 4. 5. 6. 7. proof of citizenship in any federally recognized tribe; 15 16 valid state driver's licenses; and federally issued photo Identification; 17 18 Social Security cards; 19 a copy of birth certificate; or 20 other state issued photo identifications. 21 22 All Licenses Nontransferable. No license, tag, or permit issued by the 23 DANR shall be transferable to any other person. No person shall use or borrow any wildlife license, tag or permit which has been issued to that person by the DANR, 24 DANR agents, or any other federally recognized tribe with whom the Nation has 25 entered into Wildlife Management Agreements. 26 27 28 Any person shall engage in any activity requiring a license, permit or 29 tag under this Code shall 30 Carry such license, permit or tag on their person; and 31 <u>1.</u> <u>2.</u> present such license on demand of any to: 32 33 34 **Lighthorse Office** <u>a.</u> <u>b.</u> **Cross-Commissioned Officer:** 35 Game Ranger; or 36 <u>C.</u> d. 37 **DANR Official.** 38 39 40

Any person while complying with subsection (C)(2) shall identify themselves of the license, tag or permit was issued. Failure or refusal to do so shall be prima facia evidence of violation.

- Any person convicted of violating this Code or any Regulations under this Code may have the following revoked, provided that revocations are for a period of at least (1) one year, as prescribed in the Conservation Regulations:
  - All licenses, tags, and permits held by that person; and 1.

- The privilege of applying for, purchasing or exercising the <u>2.</u> benefits conferred by the license, tag, or permit.
- For purposes of Subsection E, a court conviction, a plea of guilty, a plea of nolo contendere, the imposition of a deferred or suspended sentence by a court, or forfeiture of bond shall be deemed a conviction.

## § 3-312. Orange clothing required

No person shall hunt any wildlife any big game, with a firearm unless specified below, unless four hundred (400) square inches of the person's clothing above the waist is of a highly visible color referred to as Hunter Orange, Blaze Orange, Fluorescent Orange or Flame Orange.

## The requirements of subsection (A) shall not extend to the following В. activities:

- 1. Exemptions:
- <u>1.</u> a. Bow hunting for deer except during any muzzleloader or rifle
- b. Shotgun or bow hunting turkey; or
- <u>2.</u> 3. e. Waterfowl hunting.
- No person may hunt any public land including DANR owned or managed lands - during any big game season in which firearms are a lawful method of take, unless the individual wears at least four hundred (400) square inches above the waist, clothing of a highly visible color, referred to as Hunter Orange, Blaze Orange, Fluorescent Orange or Flame Orange.

## § 3-316. Hunting hours

- No person shall pursue, shoot, kill or attempt to take any wildlife, without expressed licensure from the DANR, between one half (1/2) hour after sunset of one (1) day and one half (1/2) hour before sunrise of the next day.
- No person shall pursue, shoot, kill or attempt to take any waterfowl or migratory birds between sunset of one (1) day and thirty (30) minutes before official sunrise of the next day.
- The prohibition of subsection (A) shall not extend to activities, where the taking of game at night is explicitly authorized by this Code or in the Conservation Regulation promulgated pursuant to this Code.
- § 3-317. Introduction or extrication of fish, wildlife, and plants
- No person shall transplant onto any lands of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation any fish or eggs into any body of water, or any wildlife, animal or plant species without

1	the express written authorization of DANR. However, this prohibition shall not extent

No person may possess, hunt, chase, harass, capture, shoot at, wound or kill, take or attempt to take, trap or attempt to trap any species beyond the date, times and methods specified in this Wildlife Code and in the Conservation Regulations. However, in no event may that permission conflict with federal agents' activities and federal law. However, in no event shall this permission conflict with federal law.

Except as otherwise provided by law, no person may possess, hunt, chase, harass, capture, shoot at, wound or kill, take or attempt to take, trap or attempt to trap any endangered or threatened species or subspecies without the specific written permission of an authorized federal agent or through the Muscogee (Creek) Nation's DANR, unless otherwise permitted by federal law.

27 28 29 80	A. State & Federal Lands. The use of, or hunting over bait, or "baiting," is prohibited on lands owned or managed by the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation or those properties owned or managed by the United States Army Corps of Engineers.
32 33 34 35 36 37	B. No Baiting Migratory Birds or Turkey. No person shall hunt or harvest any Migratory bird or Wild Turkey within one hundred (100) yards of any bait. However, the term "bait" in this subsection shall not extend to agricultural crops planted and cut consistent with regular agricultural practices. Unauthorized shaking, mowing, manipulating or altering planted crops in anyway is explicitly prohibited.
